They believe their work with the scouts creates a sense of responsibility to the community where they live, as well as a respect for the natural environment and the environment in the towns and villages where they live. Mirehouse is a neighbourhood policing priority due to the levels of youth ASB.</p> <p>Mirehouse scores high deprivation index and youth ASB is a neighbourhood policing priority in the area. Therefore, their ask for new equipment for the football club as well as linking in with Police to engage with youths who attend the club will offer a positive focus for children in the area and reduce calls for ASB.</p>	£ 2,500.00
003-24	Millom RLFC Mini Rugby	Millom (Copeland)	<p>Rugby Club are asking for new equipment to deliver rugby sessions and teach young people new skills. ASB is an ongoing issue in the area and the Rugby club help promote positive engagement through promoting healthy routine and positive use of physical and mental wellbeing. The club regularly liaise with local police officers who provide inputs on risk taking activity and good citizen inputs as well as seasonal crime and ASB inputs.</p>	£ 2,500.00
004-24	Dalton Cricket Club	Dalton (Barrow)	<p>Club is run by volunteers, who currently run an "all stars & dynamo programme for under 11, 13 and 15 jrs right through to the men's and women's adult teams. They are asking for new cricket equipment as well as funding to lease the Dalton Active Sports Hall (DASH) which is part of Dowdales School. The hire of sports hall is so that the club can run regular sessions over the winter for their teams.</p> <p>The hope is that through new equipment and regular sessions over the winter, young people can stay engaged in positive activity rather than resorting to crime/ ASB.</p> <p>Dalton suffers from ASB, with young people targeting local library and town hall causing damage. These nuisance call-outs increase over the winter period.</p> <p>Plan to have NPT officers engage with young people at sessions.</p>	£ 1,769.80
